We engaged EQT by Design to guide us through a 12-month learning and planning process to develop our racial equity strategy roadmap. The goal of this process is to determine what changes and/or new actions we need in order to integrate thoughtful, explicit consideration of racial equity to ensure our operations and programs help to advance racial justice. We recognize that this is just one step in the right direction. We are committed to the ongoing learning and work required to become and remain an anti-racist organization.

## New Affordable Rental Homes


